Kewaunee County is home to some of the most dangerous and damaging pollution from Concentrated Agricultural Operations (CAFOs) that dump

millions of tons of cow and pig manure into the environment.

Dan Zerr, UW-Extension Natural Resources Educator for the Lower Chippewa River Basin, teaches about the current status and on-going threats to area drinking water, rivers, lakes and streams.

Dick Lamers, retired Tainter Lake resident, expresses the anger and frustration of people living on toxic blue-green algae polluted lakes. This quality of life and health impact has spurred Lamar's advocacy for clean water, leading to organizing the annual Red Cedar Conference which promotes sustainable agriculture and other conservation practices.
