Many questions have been raised about the legislature's recent actions in a large number of bills regarding shoreline protection, waterways,

high-cap wells, wetlands and more. The DNR record has been studied and cited for their lack of oversight, citation issuance, and follow-up processes and procedures regarding groundwater, surface water, wells, sewage plants, CAFO's, frac sand mining and processing plants in relationship to protecting our water supplies for drinking and daily use.

On Wednesday, June 22, the WNR Board meets. One of their agenda items regards reports on wastewater permitting by Cathy Stepp about her work, knowledge level and leadership in these matters.
