HANDBOOK AND FACT SHEETS OF LOCATIONS OF METALLIC MINERAL DEPOSITS: IRON ORE AND OTHER METALS

Act 134 altered the landscape for nonferrous metallic mining in Wisconsin. As part of these changes, the WTA was able to maintain local regulatory control. Towns can regulate through zoning, licensing, and local agreements. To help prepare towns for the new landscape, the WTA provided an educational workshop in January. The Handbook is an additional educational tool. Attached and on the WTA website you will find the Nonferrous Metallic Mining Regulation Handbook. The publication summarizes best practices and highlights

some potential pitfalls to avoid. The handbook is another step in the educational process. It is neither legal advice nor a substitution for obtaining your town's own planning, zoning, legal, or other professional expertise that should be consulted to create a town's regulatory strategies. WTA may also be providing a model licensing ordinance that your town can use to frame the discussion with your town's people.
