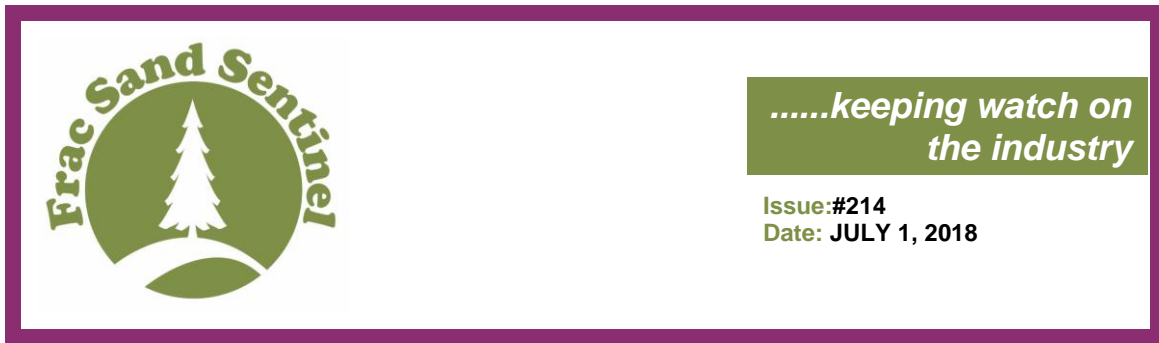


Subject: ATTEND A SESSION OF THE WISCONSIN LEAGUE OF CONSERVATION VOTERS!
