**The department has made the determination under ch. NR 150, Wis. Adm. Code, that the issuance of an initial air pollution control operation permit is not expected to have the potential to cause significant adverse environmental or secondary effects. This is a preliminary determination and does not constitute a final approval from the Air Management Program or any other DNR sections which may also require a review of the project.**

**DNR published a public notice on August 3, 2018. On August 12, 2018, DNR received a request for a public hearing for the project.**

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that, pursuant to ss. 285.13(1), 285.61(7), and 285.62(5) Wis. Stats., DNR will hold a public hearing to receive public comments on the air pollution control permit application for the proposed project.**

**The last day to provide public comment will be Tuesday, September 4, 2018.** After the public hearing and the close of the public comment period, a final decision will be made on whether to issue or deny the air pollution control permit.
